TOWN BLOCK REDEVELOPMENT:

- Earth Works:
Shaun Noble has completed the levelling of the block, and has put the pad down for the shelter shed, and has left crusher sand for pavers on the block.
- Water Supply - Hart Plumbing are going to start on the water lines this week.
- Shelter Shed – has been ordered from IKC and the paving is ordered through Mid North Landscaping.
- Pinks fencing will do the boundary fence between Farm Supplies property and the RSL and IGA Blocks.
- Lawn and Garden, once the water is done we are able to do the plan to scale for the garden and Hart Plumbing will order the pop up sprinkler system and install. After this is done the lawn can be ordered and we will need a busy bee to lay the lawn as soon as it arrives. Garden plants will be chosen once the lawn is in and the watering system.
- Horse and Dog Sculptures. These have been ordered and deposit paid from Ty Manning, and should be ready by end of July school holidays.
- Garden Seats from CWA has been ordered
- Trees: to look into the type of trees, and may be have a feature tree in the main lawn area.
- Ask Council for garden seat to go under the trees maybe one of the recycled material ones or a bench seat around the tree.

Cost around \$170 each from – Victoria. We will look into the replacement of plaques over the next few months, and possibly apply for a grant to do this.
