Correspondence:

(1) Council Lease Agreement:

A draft for the lease of the RSL block, to be checked and returned to Council

(2) Wind farm grant: Notification that Peak Body has received \$4000-00 for the block to purchase trees, plants, and fencing to go around the old machines.

Op Shop also received a grant of \$300 for new clothes racks.

TOWN BLOCK REDEVELOPMENT:

- Surveyor: done on the Farm Supplies Boundaries and the total of the IGA and RSL blocks: Total Cost. \$1244.00
- Fencing is to be done by Pinks Fencing in Clare.
Mvd S. Selth that Peak Body pay 1/2 the account \$ \$622.00 Sec S. Taylor. Crd
- Earth Works: - Shaun will start on 20th May
- Water Supply- spoken to Kim and mentioned that we will not go ahead with the drinking fountain, but will need pop up sprinklers for the lawn area and garden.
- Shelter Shed:- Mvd. William: Sec S. Selth. Crd. That we accept the quote from IKC of \$7700-00 for the block and one for the Cemetery at the same cost of \$7700-00
- Lawn and Garden, need to meet at the block when earth works are done to mark out where we want garden and lawn and the Sculpture.
- Horse and Dog Sculptures - Op Shop ordered and have paid the deposit to Ty Manning for the Sculptures.
- Garden Seats – CWA are happy to donate funds to purchase a table and chairs that can be put on the block.

Lions Club project: Kelvin Schwarz and Jim Goodfellow reported on their project for the block.

As a Service club – trying to handle it quickly as possible – Historical Society are helping put together some of the history of significant families from the town – not every family in the Hub of the Wheel book are Significant families. David Gibbs will help with naming people from 1870 may have come from the electrical roll. Family names, for the history wall.

Primary School – are looking to do mosaic pavers, and council are giving us some bigger plain cement pavers, but have not arrived yet, but we will let the school know as soon as they do and arrange for some to go to the school, so the children can start on this project.

RSL: We hope that we can build a memorial wall, from the stone saved from the RSL building, and a small memorial garden be established on the corner of the RSL site.

- Op Shop - up and down Really up cycle on the last weekend for the garage sale CWA good. Put bin away to avoid receiving every ones left overs from the Garage Sale.
- Rec Ground – no permanent caravans in the park now and will monitor that very closely.. Park looks good busy Easter. Cabin being used regularly.
